#### CODE OF CONDUCT FOR MMCOE STUDENTS

# Following are the general steps to be observed by students to maintain overall discipline and healthy environment at the Institute

- 1. Student must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the institute from time to time.
- 2. It is mandatory for student to report on the day of commencement of each term every academic year.
- 3. Student must wear college uniform twice a week as mentioned by the respective departments. Also it is mandatory for student to wear uniform for any special occasions which are conveyed well in advance as instructed by institute authorities.
- 4. It is mandatory for the student to carry/wear identity card while his/her stay in campus.
- 5. Student should read notices/emails conveyed from time to time by college authorities. Institute shall not be responsible for any type loss (academic or any other) due to negligence of student in reading the communication.
- 6. Student must check his/her email daily at least once for communication regarding academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.
- 7. It is mandatory for student to maintain 100% attendance in lectures & practical. Failure to maintain this will invite disciplinary action leading to academic and other punishments as decided by college authorities.
- 8. In case of emergency student must apply leave through teacher guardian and convey the same to concerned authorities to avoid disciplinary action.
- 9. It is mandatory for the student to maintain cleanliness and hygiene at personal level which further contributes to the cleanliness and hygiene of the institute premises.
- 10. It is highly mandatory for the student to neither to neither participate nor promote political and anti-social activities leading to disturbance in the overall Institute discipline.
- 11. As per clause 9.1 of the regulations, the High Court decision for University act 1956 regulation 26(1) G-2009, if the student is found guilty in ragging activity, he/she is liable for punishment.

- 9. Failing to observe the provisions of By-Laws or any rules laid by AICTE/DTE/University/Institute which the student is made aware of
- 10. Misuse of social media to spread content that is objectionable by laws
- 11. Indulging oneself in cyber-crime activities














# **HAPPY MUSIC SHOW at MMCOE**




The students were left teary eyed and were really moved by the performance. All the staff members appreciated their hard work and enthusiasm for life. It was nice to see their graceful faces.

# Report on Lecture on 'Career Opportunities for Engineers in Defense' by Colonel Sadanand Salunke (Retd.) Vr.C.




Colonel Salunke shared his experience of India-Pakistan war with MMCOE students. He also guided the students about competitive exams for entry in defense.




# **Report - NCC Orientation Programme**






